This information will enable you to better understand what our school will need for your child's health and wellness, and to meet the regulations. If your child's information or health condition changes during the school year, we ask that you update the health office and send in any accompanying paperwork.

Medications and Treatments:

Any and all medications, to include over-the-counter items, require a provider's order and a parent signature permitting the school to administer same. Items that are brought in must be in their original containers and labeled with the student's name. Under no circumstances should a student bring medications, including over-the-counter items into school without the required paperwork in place. All items must be picked up by the end of the school year or must be disposed of per New York State (NYS) regulations.

Physicals/Dental:

Current physicals and dental certificates are required for all students entering the school for the first time and then as follows: K; 1; 3; 5; and 7th grades. If your child plays sports, then a current physical is required yearly to ensure (s)he is safe to engage in these activities. These forms are available online.

Immunizations:

All students are required to have current, age-specific vaccines, to attend school. Religious exemptions are no longer recognized in New York State. If your child is not current, the health office will advise you and you will have to verify that your child(ren) are scheduled to receive them in order for the student to continue to attend.

Illness:

If your child will be late or absent from school, we ask that you notify reception, and for illness, notify the health office. We are required to track and trend communicable issues and to ensure your child is safe and under your care and supervisor. Failure to contact the school will result in the health office reaching out to determine the reason(s) for the student not coming to school.

Health and Emergency Forms:

Health and emergency forms will be handed out at the beginning of each school year (also available online) and are required for new entrants. These forms are required to ensure we have the most up-to-date information and individuals to contact in the rare event parent(s) cannot be reached.

Physical Education (PE):

PE is a required portion of each student's curricula. If your child cannot participate in gym, a provider's note will be necessary.
